## PENITENTIAL RITE

for his healing and forgiveness.

*Pause for silent reflection.*

**I confess to almighty God  
and to you, my brothers and sisters  
that I have sinned  
in my thoughts and in my words  
in what I have done  
and in what I have failed to do;  
and I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin  
all the Angels and Saints,  
and you, my brothers and sisters,  
to pray for me to the Lord our God.**

Ÿ. This is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Happy are those who are called to his supper.

**Ŕ. Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,  
but only say the word  
and I shall be healed.**

### Communion Verse

**Ŕ. The one who meditates day and night  
on the law of the Lord  
will yield fruit in due season.**

*Pause for silent prayer.*

through this communion  
may our Lenten penance give you glory  
and bring us your protection.

## LITURGY OF THE WORD

### Reading 1 (Jl 2:12-18)

A reading from the Book of the Prophet Joel

Even now, says the LORD,  
return to me with your whole heart,  
with fasting, and weeping, and mourning;  
Rend your hearts, not your garments,  
and return to the LORD, your God.

For gracious and merciful is he,  
slow to anger, rich in kindness,  
and relenting in punishment.  
Perhaps he will again relent

*If an Offertory Hymn is played or sung, omit the following.*

### Prayer over the Gifts

Ÿ. Pray, my brothers and sisters, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

**℟. May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his Church.**

Lord,  
help us to resist temptation  
by our Lenten works of charity and penance.  
By this sacrifice  
may we be prepared to celebrate  
the death and resurrection of Christ our Savior  
and be cleansed from sin and renewed in spirit.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

### Preface and *Sanctus* (Lent IV)
