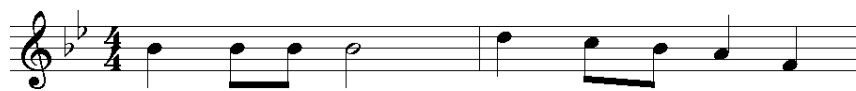

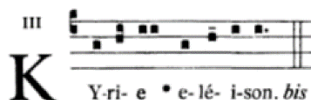
PENITENTIAL RITE (C5)

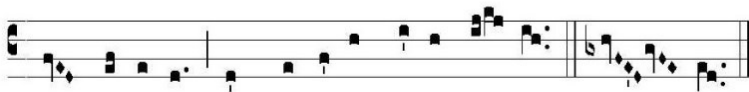

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Ephesians.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus
Christ, who has blessed us in Christ
with every spiritual blessing in the heavens,
as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the
world, to be holy and without blemish before him.
In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus
Christ, in accord with the favor of his will,

blood, the forgiveness of
transgressions,
in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us.

“Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.”
So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.




The Lord's Prayer

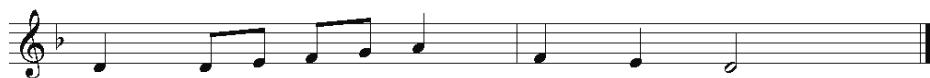


