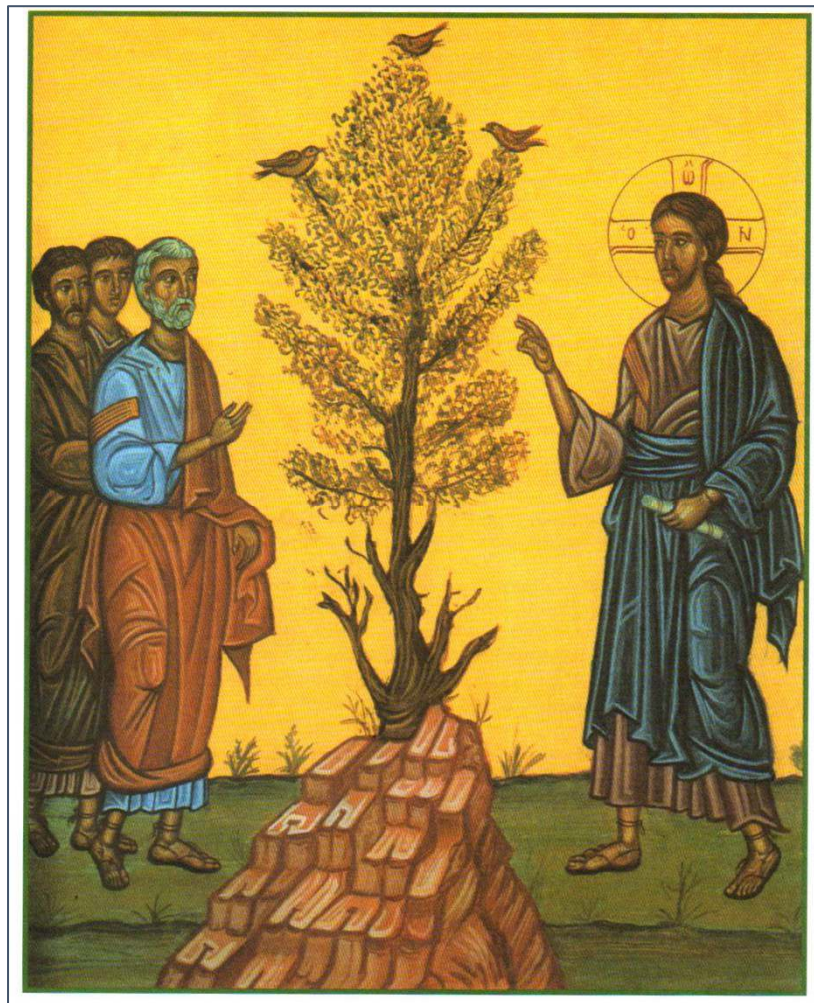

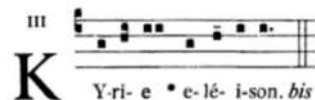
PENITENTIAL RITE (C3)

Pause for silent reflection.

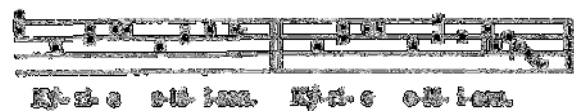

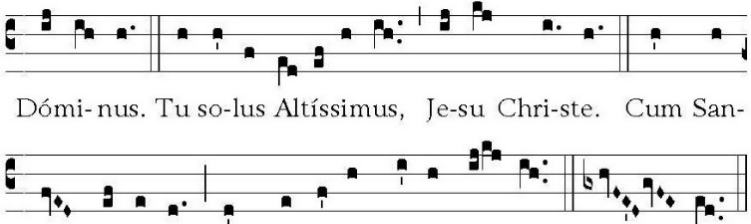

Nicene Creed

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,
